

Blackhawks' Patrick Kane to sell Trump Tower condo

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Chicago Blackhawks right winger Patrick Kane on Tuesday placed his two-bedroom, 2,076-square-foot condominium unit in the Trump International Hotel and Tower on the market for \$2.15 million.

Kane, 27, clearly isn't looking for much of a profit — if any — on the 33rd-floor unit, which he bought for \$2.06 million in September 2008.

The unit has 2 1/2 baths, views of the south, east, lake and river, high ceilings, Snaidero cabinets, a kitchen with Wolf, Miele and Sub-Zero appliances and bathrooms with limestone, slate and marble finishes.

Kane's listing agent, Chezi Rafaeli, was not immediately available for comment. However, Kane, whom the Blackhawks signed to an eight-year, \$84 million contract extension in 2014, isn't leaving town.

Instead, local agents have said Kane and Rafaeli have been spotted recently looking at single-family homes that are for sale.

Kane's departure from Trump Tower would reduce the building's star wattage. He and former [Chicago Bulls](#) guard Derrick Rose, who recently was traded to the New York Knicks, long have been the two best-known celebrities owning units in the building. Rose, who is a Chicago native, hasn't listed his 84th-floor unit for sale.

Another recent, high-profile resident of the building is former Bulls power forward Pau Gasol, who rented in Trump Tower this past season. Gasol recently left the Bulls and signed with the San Antonio Spurs.
