

Exelon CEO lists Trump Tower condo

Exelon President and CEO Christopher Crane has listed a condo at the Trump International Hotel & Tower less than two years after buying it.

Crane bought the two-bedroom unit on the 39th floor for \$2.05 million in April 2015, according to the Cook County Recorder of Deeds. He listed it this week for just under \$2.1 million, or 2 percent more than he paid.

The listing makes no mention of improvements or changes to the condo since Crane bought it 20 months ago. Listing agent Chezi Rafaeli of Coldwell Banker declined to comment.

Exelon spokesman Paul Adams said Crane's primary residence is in the suburbs and he was using the Trump condo as an in-town residence near the company's headquarters. Adams said Crane is selling because he has bought another place.

The 2,000-square-foot condo has views east along the Chicago River and the skyline, as well as two fireplaces and a master-bedroom closet 25 feet long, according to the listing.

Crane joined the old Chicago utility firm ComEd in 1998. ComEd owner Unicom later merged with Philadelphia-based PECO Energy to form Exelon, which is now the largest electricity-distribution company and one of the biggest power generators in the U.S. He became president and CEO **in 2012**.

Earlier this year, 62 percent of Exelon shareholders voted against the company's executive compensation plan, in part because of **the nearly \$16 million in compensation** Crane received in 2015.
